# **Employment Nelson-Tasman**

### Introduction

The region enjoys competitive advantages in forestry due to climate, stable soils, comparative lower costs of production, and closeness to port facilities. Virtually all the forests are within 50km of the city. There are an estimated 100,000 hectares in forest plantations, this represents 10% of the total land area.

# Employment in the Industry

1600 people were employed locally in the forestry industry, in the year 2000.

- Forestry is a progressive industry with opportunities in many different areas such as solid wood processing, wood panel manufacturing, pulp and paper manufacturing, bio-security, management, office and consultant positions.
- With massive volumes of trees maturing in the next two to five years, the key suppliers will be needing qualified staff. There will be an increased demand for skilled workers and allied support services such as processing and transportation.
- Nelson Pine Industries operate a medium density fibreboard plant 24 hours day. The longest hours in the world.

# What Employers Are Looking For

- Physical strength is required as work in sawmills is physically demanding, involving stacking and handling lumber. Minimum qualifications are School Cert (NCEA Level 1) maths, english, science and some indication of mechanical aptitude. Also required are good communication skills, motivation, commitment, interpersonal skills, and practical experience in horticulture. A Diploma in Horticulture, or NZHITO are required.
- Those who have grown up in the country, or have rural experience, who enjoy being outside in different weather conditions do well in this industry.
- Experience working with machinery, or interaction with people, is helpful.

#### **Current Skill Shortages**

- Saw doctors are in short supply and the rates they can charge are climbing. Note it takes two to three years to train as a saw doctor.
- **Pruners** positions, such as forestry pruners, continue to be difficult to fill in the region.
- **Apprentices.** There is a general shortage of young people entering this industry.
- The Forestry industry have a current skill shortage across the board for experienced forestry workers, and are having to recruit workers with a minimum of skills.

- Certificate in Forest Silviculture Christchurch, duration 20 weeks.
- Automotive/Fishing/Forestry/Driving TOPS Nelson Technical Institute, duration is flexible, leads towards NC in Forestry.
