Employment Nelson-Tasman

Introduction

Nelson is a major destination for domestic travel and tourism, and is experiencing rapid growth in international visitor numbers.

New Zealand is renowned for offering new and innovative experiences like 'bungee jumping.' One of the key elements locally is our three national parks.

Abel Tasman National Park, Nelson Lakes National Park, and Kahurangi National Park, are all within easy driving distance of each other. Major tourism areas identified as Natural Nelson are:

- ◆ **Adventure Nelson** includes kayaking, tramping, rafting, sky diving and caving.
- ◆ **Lifestyle Nelson** includes beaches, rivers and boating, local cuisine, wineries, cafés, lodges, Bed & Breakfasts.
- ◆ **Artistic Nelson** which includes over 300 fulltime artists. A main feature is the Wearable Arts Festival held each year in September.

Employment in the Industry

Over 2700 people are employed in the visitor/tourism industry in the Nelson region, and this is expected to rise.

- ◆ Though the work is often demanding and varied, a person with the right attitude, people skills and work ethics can go far in this industry.
- ◆ There is potential for further development in outdoor-guided experiences such as caving, white-water kayaking, and rock climbing.
- ◆ Most of these industries rely on the seasonal influx of visitors, and so employment varies with the time of year.
- ◆ Tourism offers a wide range of employment opportunities. The majority of full time employment is offered in cafés and restaurants.
- ◆ Over 600 people are employed in the accommodation sector and over 750 are employed in café's and restaurants.
- ◆ Adventure tourism employs guides, drivers, mechanics, reception, or retail staff.
- ◆ Due to the nature of adventure tourism, guides tend to move around from one season to the next. In this way they gain a variety of skills, which is an advantage to employers.

What Employers Are Looking For

- ◆ **Adventure Tourism Guide** – A good knowledge of one's own country and a passenger service licence is helpful and/or local knowledge is also an advantage.
- ◆ Previous life experience, maturity, risk management, adventure guiding, bus driving or chef experience an advantage.
- ◆ **SKOANZ** sea kayaking certificate, through a certified instructor.

Current Skill Shortages

- ◆ Qualified cooks, chefs and kitchen hands are always in short supply during the summer season.
- ◆ A recent trainee managers shortfall was overcome by internally promoting and training existing staff.
- ◆ There is a national shortage of Sea Kayaking Operators Association of New Zealand, qualified sea kayak guides – especially women guides.

- ◆ **Adventure Tourist**-Guides are also often qualified as raft guides, white water kayak instructors, and or snow ski guides. Army or teacher training is useful.
- ◆ **Nelson Marlborough Institute of Technology (NMIT)** offers a wide range of tourism courses including Adventure Tourism/Outdoor Leadership 34 weeks, Introduction to Tourism and Hospitality 12 weeks, Certificate in Professional Restaurant, Wine and Bar Service 34 weeks, Certificate in Travel 34 weeks, Certificate in Adventure Tourism 34 weeks, Diploma in Tourism 2 years.
